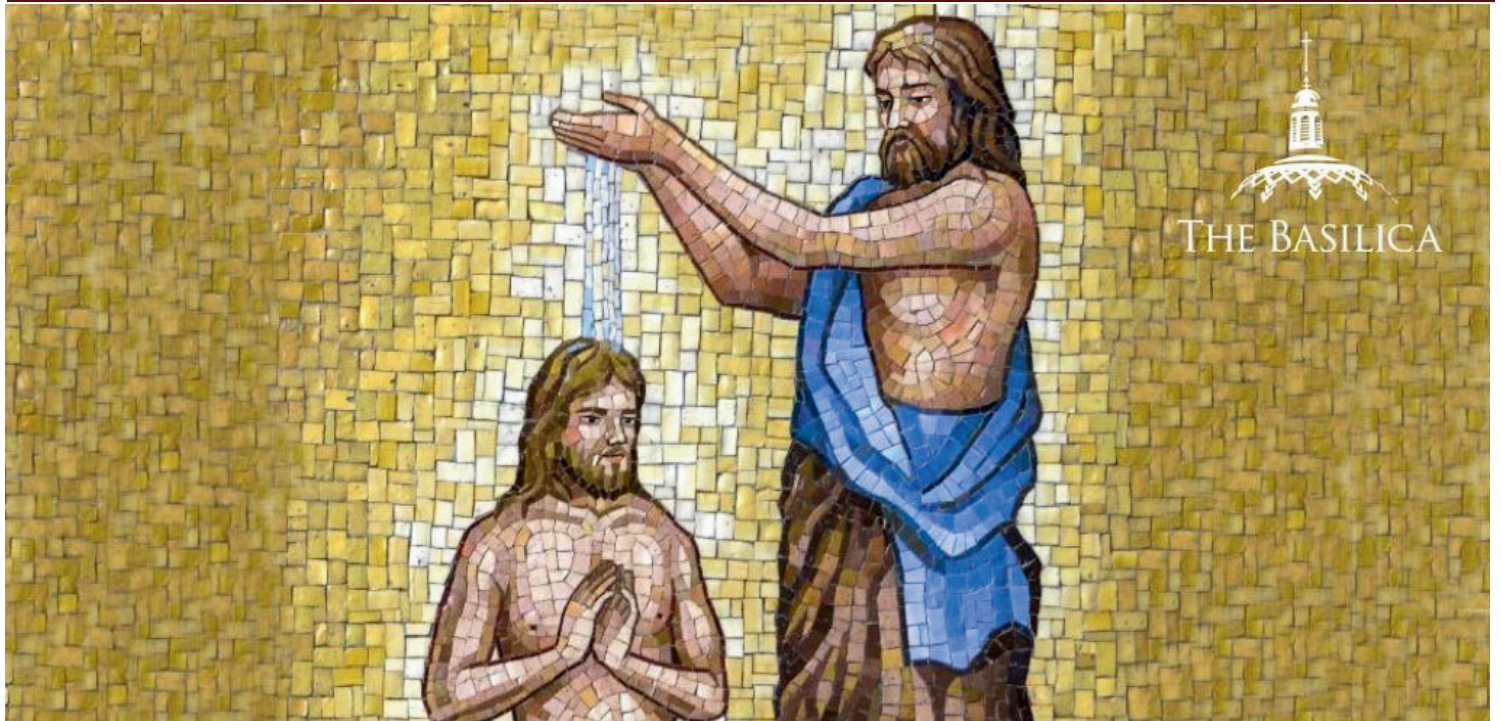


# CATHOLIC CHURCH OF THE RESURRECTION

The Feast of the LORD's Baptism is a hinge, concluding the holy Christmas Season & starting Ordinary Time. While we heard Matthew's version of this event, John's version is used as Jesus is about to begin His earthly ministry. The Evangelist John recorded the Baptist not exactly sure Who the Messiah was going to be even though, in Matthew's Gospel, he did know according to his resistance to do the baptizing. Perhaps he was not sure from his childhood that Jesus was the Messiah, and perhaps the Holy Spirit revealed it to him as Jesus arrived in Matthew's version. In either case, by the time Jesus presented Himself to be baptized, John knew He was "the Lamb of God."

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ -

As we begin Ordinary Time, we hear the beginnings of Jesus' earthly ministry, some of which is His calling His first disciples. While God is always calling us, do we listen or embark when He does? Are we able to hear Him, or are we busy with the cacophony of the world which competes for our attention against God?

Often, I myself struggle between worldly obligations & prayer time. I have come to recognize that I need to "just go" when I hear or feel that invitation to prayer & not wait till "I just need to get this one more thing done." When we accept that soft voice & cooperate, we open ourselves up to hearing more & receiving more grace. Acting more on the worldly voice(s) to do busy-work makes His Voice more distant.

After I entered seminary, there was a billboard advertisement that the Archdiocese of Chicago put up, saying: "If you are waiting for a sign from God; this is it: consider the priesthood."

If you are waiting for a sign from God to read the Bible, THIS IS IT: consider either reading the Scriptures you heard at Mass OR pre-read the upcoming Sunday readings. What are you waiting for?

**NEXT SUNDAY'S READINGS**

**Third Sunday of Ordinary Time**

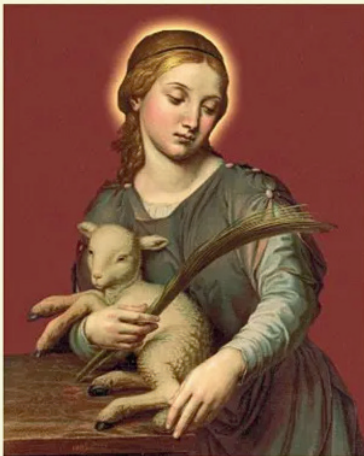
In next weekend's readings we hear Jesus call His first disciples, the fishermen: Andrew and his brother Peter; John and his brother James. Matthew's version is shorter than the Gospel of John where Simon brought Jesus home first where He healed Simon's mother-in-law. Luke's Gospel showed that Simon Peter did not immediately follow but needed the miracle of the superabundance of fish in Luke 5. Such variations in Gospels reveal that, while the same events throughout Jesus' ministry occurred, often the evangelists remember the details differently. The Holy Spirit allowed this to occur for a reason. It is also important to remember that of the (4) Gospels, two of them were not Apostles or even disciples until after Pentecost. Nevertheless, we believe the Gospel to be as God wanted it as the Holy Spirit guides and protects God's Church.

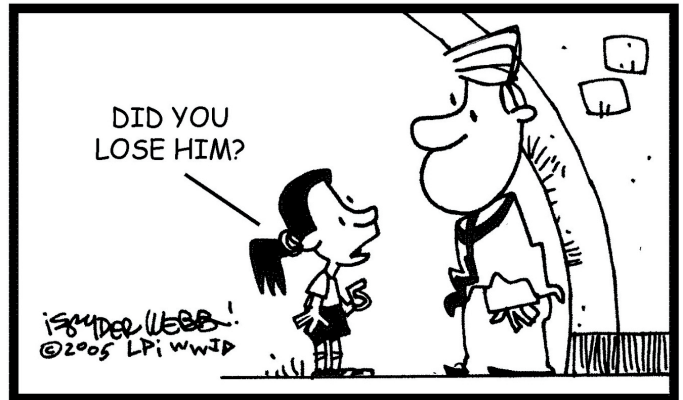
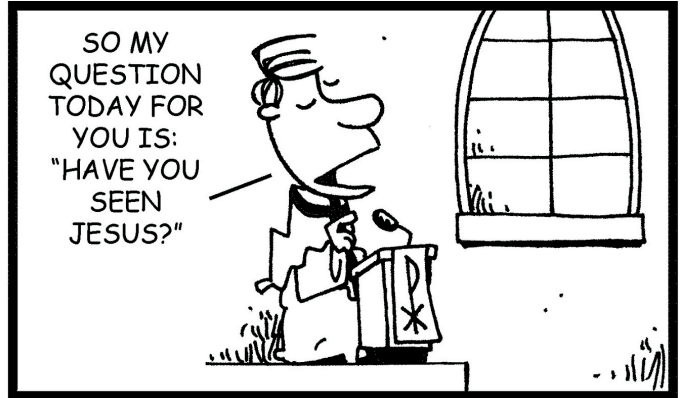
