PASTOR'S CORNER

Happy All Saints' and Souls' Day weekend!

On this weekend it is important to remember a few things. There are (3) “Churches” or parts of Church: the Church Militant (here on earth fighting the good fight); the Church Triumphant (those who are celebrating having won the good fight); and the Church Suffering (those in “purgatory”).

A teacher asked her students how does one become a saint. One girl said “you have to love and take care of the sick” while a boy said “you have to perform miracles.” After a minute of silence, another boy yelled out: “You gotta be dead!” Indeed, it is a combination of those things. While in this life, we are called to be saints while we are still sinners, but if we made it into Heaven, we are saints.

Only saints are ready for the bright Light of Christ and have full union with God and everyone else who has full union with God. If we have grudges, we are not ready to have full union with God and everyone else who is there. If we have not reconciled our sins, we are not ready also. But if we do not get into Heaven “right away,” this does not mean we are in “the other place.”

In various parts of Scripture (Malachi 3: 2-3; Zechariah 13: 9), we hear about a refiner’s fire that will purify us of whatever dross exists as it does not belong in Heaven. Hell is often depicted with words such as “fiery Gehenna,” but purgatory is a place of purification, healing, and preparation. At the moment of death, we will see our lives in the Light of Christ. We may catch a glimpse of the Face of God, but lose the Beatific Vision as we are not ready for the fullness of Heaven. That is the torture of “purgatory”: we could have had it right away, but we did not work on some things.

But the good news is we will go to Heaven - sometime soon! In that case we will need the prayers of those still alive in the Church Militant; they can no longer merit the graces to be forgiven of their sins. This is why we are called to have Mass intentions which is rooted in 2 Maccabees 12 as Judas took up a collection from his soldiers to pray for those who had died. If we persevere in our discipleship, we need not worry about things, but if we take things for granted, we might wish we had tried a little harder in some areas or forgave people when we had the chance.

THIS WEEKEND'S READINGS: 32ND SUNDAY OF ORDINARY TIME

This weekend celebrates All Souls' Day and, thus, have different readings. The Gospel comes from the introduction to the Bread of Life Discourse in John 6 and is often heard at funerals:

"Everything the Father gives Me will come to Me, and I will not reject anyone who comes to Me, because I came down from Heaven not to do My own will but the Will of the One who sent Me. And this is the Will of the One Who sent Me, that I should not lose anything of what He gave Me, but that I should raise it on the last day."

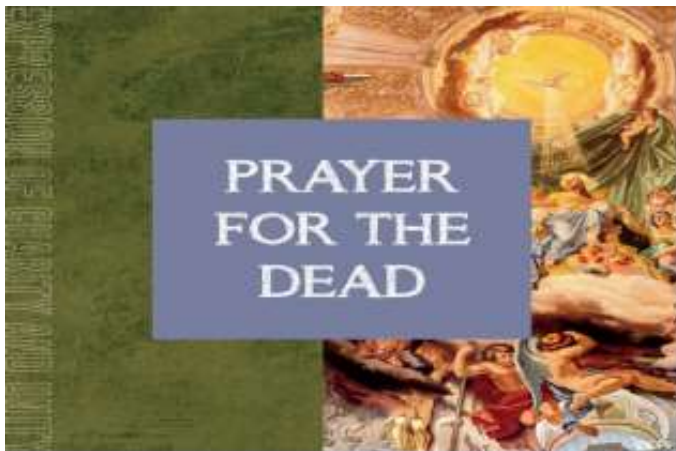
STEWARDSHIP

Autumn stewardship refers to caring for natural resources and environments during the Fall season. The wise man knows that the more storing away in Autumn and tempering of self-indulgence, the more comfortable and ready he will be later. This is evident in the Old Testament when Joseph, Jacob's son, was put in place to get the Mediterranean through the 7-year famine. Thus, autumn stewardship can refer to religious stewardship, where congregations or groups reflect on and plan for the months ahead. As disciples of Christ, we are taught and prepared for the concept of sacrifice.
