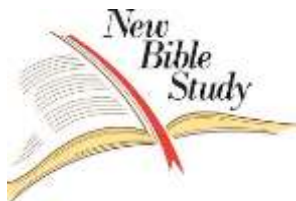

PASTOR'S CORNER

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

While we may have enjoyed our Labor Day festivities, even freeing our thoughts from the tragedy in Minnesota, our thoughts and prayers should never be void of what others in the Church suffer from and endure. After all, St. Paul wrote to the Romans (12:15): "Rejoice with those who rejoice; weep with those who weep." After all, we are members of the mystical body of Christ, the Church, and we should never lose sight of one thing as the members of Jesus are connected.

At the same time, life goes on - even though those who have lost a child, it seems life has completely changed for the worse. We must pray for those families that those still with other children not lose sight of the joys that they can still have. How often do we lose sight of the good that we still have in our lives when something tragic, even though not tragically bad, has befallen us? Do we let it imprison us from enjoying other things in life?

In my difficulties as a priest, the Serenity Prayer has helped (to various degrees) me:

God, grant me the serenity to accept the things I cannot change; the courage to change the things that I can; and the wisdom to know the difference; living one day at a time, enjoying one moment at a time, accepting hardships as the pathway to peace; taking, as Jesus did, this sinful world as it is, not as I would have it, trusting that He will make all things right if I surrender to His Will; so that I may be reasonably happy in this life and supremely happy forever with Him in the Next.

Next weekend's readings:

Next weekend celebrates “the Exaltation (or Triumph) of the Cross.” As a result, we deviate from the normal chronology of the Lectionary and hear the Gospel that recorded Jesus’ conversation with Nicodemus in which He said: “just as Moses lifted up the serpent in the desert, so must the Son of Man be lifted up, so that everyone who believes in Him may have Eternal Life.” Then we hear what Christians love to quote: “God so loved the world that He gave His only Son, so that everyone who believes in Him might not perish but might have Eternal Life.” Often, Christians use this to comfort them in our sinfulness that we are guaranteed Eternal Life. But this is presumption when we need to act more on faith and faithfulness. In our faithfulness, we know that we will commit sin, but that all we need to do is turn to the LORD to receive His mercy but we almost must share that same mercy with others. Belief and faith entail living according to what our faith tells us to do.
