## PASTOR'S CORNER

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

It is somewhat ironic that celebrating Labor Day means we take a holiday away from the work for which we are paid. It is important to keep things in mind and in a balance. God Himself labored for (6) days, creating a universe including ourselves, and then He rested on the 7th day. Having created Adam but acknowledging "it is not good for man to be alone" and creating Eve, they soon committed the sin that effected their eviction from the Garden of Eden. Among the consequences of their sin was that "you shall labor to eat all the days of your life. By the sweat of your brow you shall eat bread, until you return to the ground..." (Cf. Genesis 3: 17-19).

God knew all this would transpire and did not feel He labored in vain with His Creation. So too with us: our labor has a purpose. All that we do (or at least should) is to demonstrate and make visible our faith and our love for God and neighbor. All we do should be done with love and out of love. We do not labor simply for the sake of working. Our labor should bear fruit. Enjoy the holiday weekend! +

In next weekend's readings Jesus raises the bar on discipleship: "If anyone comes to Me without hating his father and mother, wife and children, brothers and sisters, and even his own life, he cannot be My disciple." He knew that, when it was time for His Apostles to build His Church after Pentecost, Jewish family members would have to pick a side: the Jewish status quo or become Christian. It was not going to be pretty. The same holds true for today: we either choose to follow Jesus or we do it "myway." Jesus is "the Way, the Truth, and the Life" and our ways are not always His ways. But "my way" does not get us to Heaven - only His.
