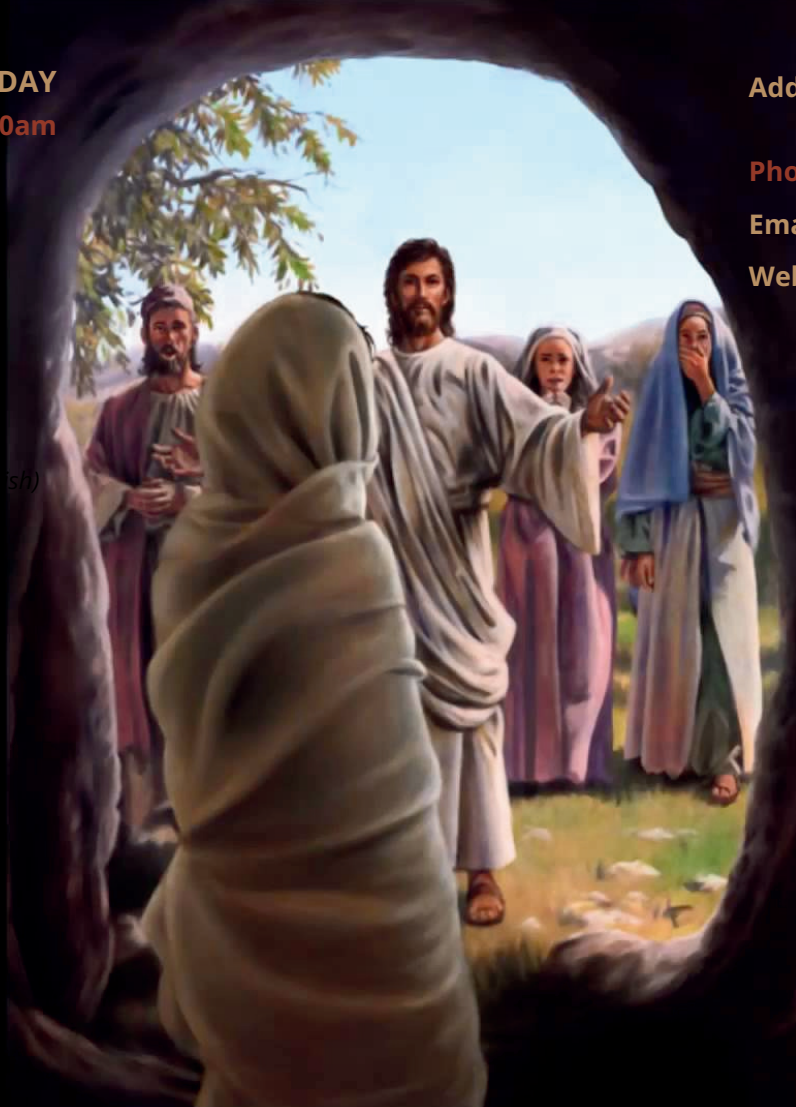

This significant event, recorded only in the Gospel of John, provides a great deal of information, more than just the third time Jesus raised someone from the dead. This time He delayed His arrival so that He would raise Lazarus after 4 days being in the tomb. This was to show that He had the power even after a few days in a tomb.

Secondly, as in other parts of John's Gospel, we have one of His "I Am" statements: "I Am the Resurrection and the Life" (John 11: 25). His "I Am" statements troubled those who struggled with having faith in Him, because it seemed blasphemous. At the burning bush, God revealed Himself to Moses as "I Am Who Am." Either you believe(d) in Jesus, or you didn't/don't.

NEXT SUNDAY'S READINGS**Palm Sunday and Holy Week**

In next weekend's readings we hear of Jesus' final but triumphant entrance into Jerusalem, only for Him to be led outside the city walls to be crucified. It was part of the Jewish way not to have any blood spilled inside the city walls, except on the altar in the Temple. This fulfilled the Jewish tradition of Yom Kippur, when the people would confess their sins to the Jewish priest who would lay the sacrificial offerings on the goat and drive it out of the city where it would die and be seen no more - along with the people's sins. This became the scapegoat which Jesus became for us. Have we prayed the Stations of the Cross this Lent during which we follow Jesus closely to Calvary?

**PASTOR'S LETTER**

Dear brothers and sisters,

While Canon Law requires every pastor/parish to have a finance council that guides the pastor in his decisions, a pastoral council is not required and many pastors have one while others do not. This is the first time as a priest that I arrived at a parish - either Catholic Church of the Resurrection or Our Lady Star of the Sea - that did not have a pastoral council in place.

While some priests do not have a pastoral council, I find them helpful when it is properly comprised of those who wish to cooperate with the growth of the parish and not in it for their own agendas. The council advises the pastor who wants their counsel. The council does not make the decisions - unless the pastor asks them to do so for detailed activities.

In my previous parishes, I have had a council of (9) members who are elected for 3-year terms. That allows the other (6) to provide continuity. As we are starting from scratch, we will start with (7) members: (2) of whom are active in the Hispanic community. The other (5) should be involved in ministries or organizations of the overall parish. These members facilitate communication to/from the pastor. Participation in other ministries demonstrates that they already serve the parish and are familiar with its operations.

If interested, please contact Jean O'Rourke in the parish office or myself. Jean will have a form to complete. In the event we have more applicants than the (7) openings, we will choose based upon these forms ensuring that we have a good representation of the parish from these council members. This is the best way to bring ideas and assist me in how to shepherd this flock. This council will meet monthly, except December and either July or August.

I look forward to this council advising me and helping me to communicate with parishioners of Catholic Church of the Resurrection effectively and fruitfully!

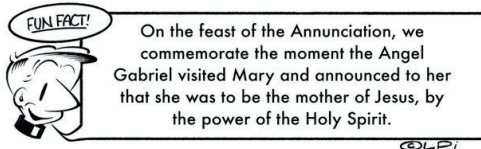

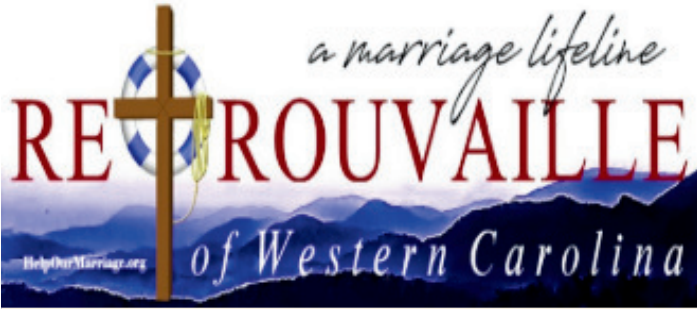

The Diocese of Charleston currently has 246 permanent deacons — 182 are active and 42 are retired; 102 of them are age 70 or older. The formation program for aspirants lasts five and a half years, with a new class beginning every two years.
