Born in Wadowice, Poland on May 18, 1920, Karol Wojtyla became Pope John Paul II when he was elected to be the 264th Pope in October 1978. Several of his family members died by the time he was 21. Upon graduating from high school, he enrolled in Cracow's Jagiellonian University in 1938, but the Nazi forces closed the university sending Karol to work in a quarry for a few years & in a chemical factory to

earn his living & avoid being deported to Germany. During this time, he was feeling called to the priesthood & began priestly formation in the Cracow seminary, completing his studies after World War II. Ordained to the priesthood on November 1, 1946, Fr. Wojtyla himself taught in seminary. Eventually, he was consecrated an auxiliary bishop on September 28, 1958 & was later nominated Archbishop of Cracow on January 13, 1964. Pope Paul VI made him a cardinal on June 26, 1967. During his pontificate, John Paul II completed 95 pastoral visits outside of Italy, wrote 14 encyclicals, 13 apostolic exhortations, 11 apostolic constitutions, 42 apostolic letters, & published 3 books: *Crossing the Threshold of Hope*, *Gift and Mystery: On the 50th Anniversary of My Priestly Ordination*, & *Roman Tryptych - Meditations*. His feast day is October 22.

PASTOR'S CORNER

Happy Autumn Greetings,

It has certainly been a busy 4 ½ months since I arrived. While I have met with many parish ministry heads & groups along with other individuals, I must also admit that other times it takes me days to return a phone call or meet with people. Admittedly, some have not been happy with me. Last week while rushing to Charleston for a variety of appointments, I reflected on this. It came to me that learning & fulfilling the responsibilities of being a new pastor is like being a student who needs to do the work himself.

While we have parochial vicars to assist with sacramental & ministerial matters, some activities or responsibilities must be done by the pastor. Just as a student cannot ask someone else to do his research, write papers, conduct interviews, or experience internships; they have to do the learning & earn the grades themselves. As the pastor I am accountable to the Diocese & other civil authorities. We know that we have facility needs in our various buildings.

Amidst all the parochial matters, I am also trying to ascertain what to delegate to my brother priests here. Currently, I depend on them for funerals & Masses of course, confessions, & sick calls. I hope that, after getting things under my belt, to visit people in the hospitals, but these are the tasks or ministries that I can entrust to them while I am getting things in process. So, if it has been slow responding to a request to talk or meet, I apologize. Humorously, I'd like to remind people that Bishop Jacques said at my installation Mass that people should not ask me for anything for (100) days, but I know that many may be in need - & as a reminder, we also have two communities between North Myrtle Beach & Loris.

NEXT WEEKEND'S READINGS: 30TH SUNDAY OF ORDINARY TIME

Next weekend's Gospel teaches about humility, comparing a fictitious Pharisee to an ordinary man who was a sinner. While the Pharisee may have had few sins, his pride was a problem. The layman, on the other hand, knew he had sins weighing upon him; but the difference was his humility, acknowledging his need for God's mercy. The Pharisee, in contrast, felt that he did not need God's mercy; his pride blinded him, preventing him from seeing where he was not perfect. Whenever we think we do not need to go to confession, our pride is at work. But we also need to be mindful that we may focus on sins that distract us from going deeper. The Church recommends at least once a year, but we should consider a few times a year.
