

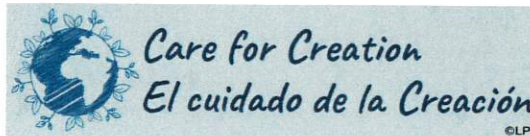
CATHOLIC CHURCH OF THE RESURRECTION

April 19, 2026 | Third Sunday of Easter

The famous Walk to Emmaus recorded two of Jesus' disciples leaving Jerusalem for a town 7 miles northwest. Galilee was due north; thus, they were neither staying in Jerusalem nor heading to Galilee which was what the angels asked Mary Magdalene to tell Jesus' disciples. They were heading in the wrong direction. Consequently, Jesus appears to turn them around, using Scripture to do so. Then, the Word of God was made flesh "in the Breaking of the Bread."



El famoso Camino a Emaús relata cómo dos discípulos de Jesús salían de Jerusalén hacia un pueblo a unas siete millas al noroeste. Galilea estaba al norte; por lo tanto, no se quedaban en Jerusalén ni se dirigían a Galilea, que era lo que los ángeles le habían pedido a María Magdalena que dijera a los discípulos de Jesús. Iban en la dirección equivocada. En consecuencia, Jesús aparece para hacerlos regresar, utilizando las Escrituras para hacerlo. Luego, la Palabra de Dios se hizo carne "en la Fracción del Pan."

DESDE EL ESCRITORIO DEL PASTOR

¡Continuamos con los saludos de Pascua!

Para quienes estamos familiarizados con películas y programas de televisión en blanco y negro, podemos tener sentimientos encontrados al ver programas que no están en color. Puede traer sentimientos de nostalgia; o puede deprimirnos al no tener color. Estudios han demostrado que la falta de luz solar con el tiempo puede deprimir a las personas, mientras que los colores brillantes pueden tener el efecto contrario.

Esto podría ser un paralelo simplificado de lo que experimentaban los discípulos de Jesús en los primeros días o semanas después de Su Resurrección. Ellos estaban bajo la oscuridad del conocimiento de que, al morir, las personas van al Seol (el lugar de los muertos), al menos hasta que el Mesías cambiara todo eso. Durante unos días, sus esperanzas fueron destruidas y sus vidas eran aún peores. Pero Su Resurrección y Sus apariciones ocasionales pintaron colores gloriosos de esperanza en el lienzo de la vida: colores de esperanza, promesa, gloria y eternidad.

Ahora tenían conocimiento junto con la fe de que Jesús era el Mesías, Dios, y que los amaba — y murió y resucitó por ellos. ¿Tenemos nosotros esta experiencia? ¿Tenemos este contraste de emociones? Debido a que venimos de una larga línea de antepasados que creen en la Resurrección — tanto la de Él como la nuestra esperada — a veces lo damos por hecho. Los Judíos Cristianos de aquel tiempo tenían este contraste al haber creído en lo que IBA a suceder y ahora vivir la esperanza y la fe de lo que AHORA era posible. Y lo apreciaban y estaban llenos de alegría.

PASTOR'S LETTER

Continued Easter greetings!

For those of us familiar with movies and tv shows in black and white, we may have mixed feelings watching shows that are not in color. It may bring nostalgic feelings; or it may depress us as they are without color. Studies have shown that the lack of sunlight over time can depress people while bright colors can have the opposite effect.

This could be an over-simplified parallel to what Jesus' disciples were experiencing those first days or weeks after His Resurrection. They had been under the gloom of the knowledge that, upon dying, people go to Sheol (the place of the dead) - at least until the Messiah changed all that. For a few days, their hopes were crushed and their lives were even worse. But His Resurrection and occasional appearances painted glorious colors of hope on the canvas of life: colors of hope, promise, glory, and for an eternity.

They now had knowledge along with faith that Jesus was the Messiah, God, and He loved them - and died and resurrected for them. Do we have this experience? Do we have this contrast of emotions? Because we come from a long line of ancestors who believe in the Resurrection - both His and our hopeful one - we take this for granted. The Jewish-Christians back then had this contrast having believed in what WAS going to happen and now the hope and faith of what was NOW possible. And they appreciated it and were filled with joy.

Fourth Sunday of Easter

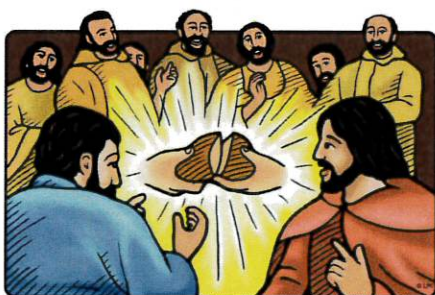
The Fourth Sunday of Easter is also called Good Shepherd Sunday as the Gospels, though different between Cycles A, B, or C, all record Jesus talking about Himself as the Good Shepherd and what a good shepherd does for the sheep: the sheep know His Voice and follow because the Good Shepherd lays down His life for His sheep. Those who are His sheep listen to it and follow.

STEWARDSHIP

In Luke 17: 5, the Apostles said to Jesus: "Increase our faith." Faith has degrees; there is a foundation upon which it can grow. Faith is a theological virtue, meaning it requires the Holy Spirit to plant it. However, for it to grow requires us to invest and cultivate it, cooperating with God's grace and taking leaps of faith that make it grow. God does not force us; He provides but we are responsible to develop our own faith. All that we do either strengthens it or detracts from it

Cuarto Domingo de Pascua

El Cuarto Domingo de Pascua también se llama Domingo del Buen Pastor, ya que los Evangelios, aunque diferentes entre los Ciclos A, B o C, todos presentan a Jesús hablando de sí mismo como el Buen Pastor y lo que hace un buen pastor por sus ovejas: las ovejas conocen Su Voz y lo siguen porque el Buen Pastor da su vida por sus ovejas. Aquellos que son sus ovejas escuchan su voz y lo siguen.

ADMINISTRACIÓN

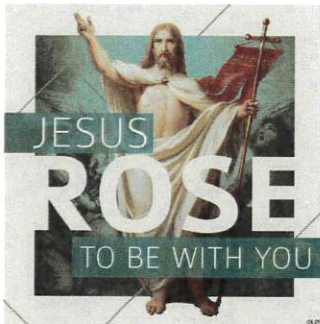
