CATHOLIC SCHOOLS WEEK

Catholic Schools Week (CSW) is the annual celebration of Catholic education in the United States. CSW runs from the last Sunday in January through the following Saturday. At the request of NCEA membership, a second week was added for Catholic schools to leverage their good news in a national initiative: Discover Catholic Schools Week (DCSW). We seek to help schools connect with prospective families, donors, educators, and community members. It has been documented that Catholic schools on average have higher test scores than public schools and Catholic school teachers can tell you that they are not paid as much as those in the public school sector. They do this out of love and as a ministry. As a result of less funding, Catholic schools may not have the sports departments and other overhead, but we strive to educate and provide faith formation for children and their families. Schools also fulfill Jesus' Great Commission to go and teach the Christian faith.

PASTOR'S LETTER

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ -

Some of us have seen other larger, perhaps more glorious church buildings during our lives depending on our age and travel experience. As someone who, as a seminarian and as part of his class at seminary, followed the footsteps of St. Paul in Turkey, Greece, and Rome, I can tell you what the early churches looked like - to some degree. Of course, as we looked at them, time had taken its toll. The oldest church we saw was a cave in Antioch where "the disciples were first called Christians" (Acts 11: 26). We were doubly fortunate as shortly after we were honored to witness this, the civil authorities declared it unsafe and uninhabitable. We saw the cracks in the walls through which water was coming in, but it was an original church where "the breaking of the Bread" was celebrated in the first decades.

We are blessed and probably take for granted the air conditioning or heat, cushioned chairs, and other modernizations along with hymnody. We come to expect this and, when something changes, we do not like it. But people did not always have these blessings. While Our Lady Star of the Sea is undergoing a renovation during which we celebrate Mass in the parish hall, we at Catholic Church of the Resurrection are growing and may want other things, such as space and facilities to do things that currently we cannot. Wherever we go, we should focus on what matters most at Mass: we celebrate the loving Sacrifice Jesus made for us. Do we do our best to participate in the Mass and make whatever sacrifices and "offer it up" for His glory as well as for the graces He will bestow on us? Doing this out of love, faith, and humility merits the graces needed for our spiritual family to grow.

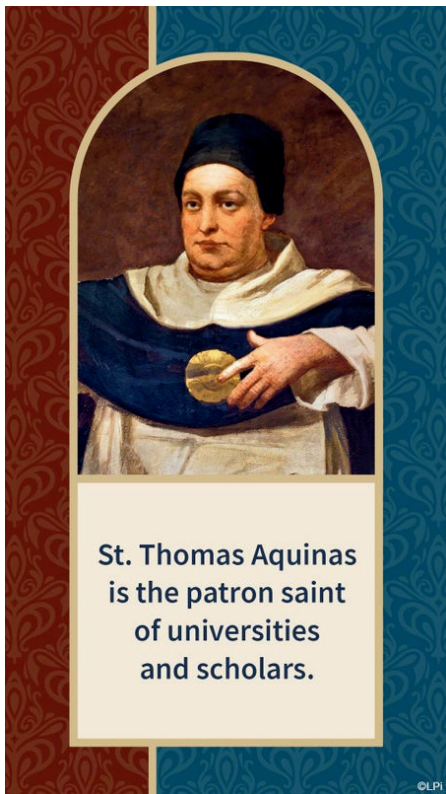

Fourth Sunday of Ordinary Time

Next weekend's readings remind us of the Beatitudes and what Jesus said in His Sermon on the Mount. We use the words "bless" and "blessed" for many things. We bless water and we also bless God. The word encompasses different things. These teachings are called the Beatitudes for a reason and we also see this word in the word "Beatification" which is the process of declaring a man or woman a "saint" who was holy in life but has since died. The beatitudes of those who are "blessed" encourage those who are undergoing difficulties that "this will not last forever and something much better is around the corner." In other words "you will be happy" to say the least; you are on the way to something that will elate you. God knows what awaits us; meanwhile, we need the Beatitudes to help us "hang in there."

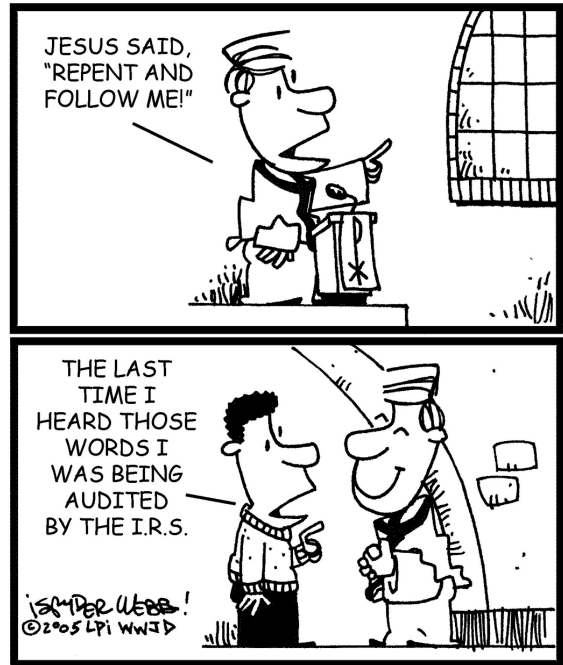
