ES VERDAD QUE RECIBIMOS DONES DEL ESPÍRITU SANTO?

En el Bautismo recibimos auténticos dones espirituales del Espíritu Santo cuyo objetivo es ayudarnos a vivir una vida de virtud. Estos siete dones (Isaías 11:1-3) nos abren a la gracia y a las indicaciones del Espíritu. Cuanto más los usamos, más poderosos son. También son reforzados por el sacramento de la Confirmación.

Sabiduría: Este don nos ayuda a centrarnos en la voluntad de Dios y en su plan para nosotros.

Entendimiento: Nos permite comprender las verdades de la fe con nuestra mente y nuestro corazón.

Consejo: Llamado también “juicio justo”, el don de consejo os permite sopesar todas las alternativas para elegir la opción (moral) justa.

Fortaleza: El valor o la habilidad de ser firmes en nuestra búsqueda del bien a pesar de las presiones.

Ciencia: Una persona iluminada por el don de la ciencia ve en las cosas más de una dimensión a fin de decidir cuál es el camino correcto.

Piedad: Este don nos ayuda a pensar en nosotros como hijos de Dios y a estar dispuestos a servirlo.

Temor de Dios: La maravilla y el asombro que Dios inspira nos anima a respetarlo a Él y a todas sus criaturas.

DO WE REALLY RECEIVE GIFTS FROM THE HOLY SPIRIT?

At Baptism, we receive actual, spiritual gifts from the Holy Spirit intended to help us live virtuous lives. Traditionally numbered seven (Isaiah 11:1-3), these gifts make us receptive to grace and the promptings of the Spirit. They grow stronger the more we use them. They are also strengthened by the Sacrament of Confirmation.

WISDOM: This gift helps us stay focused on God's will and his plan for us.

UNDERSTANDING: Lets us grasp truths of the faith with our mind and heart.

COUNSEL: Also called "right judgment," counsel enables us to weigh all the alternatives to make the right (moral) choice.

FORTITUDE: Courage, or the ability to remain firm in seeking the good against all pressures.

KNOWLEDGE: A person with knowledge sees more than one dimension of an issue to determine the right path.

PIETY: This gift helps us think of ourselves as children of God and be eager to serve him.

FEAR OF THE LORD: The wonder and awe God inspires encourages us to respect him and all his creations.

WHY DO CATHOLICS BELIEVE IN ANGELS?

Angels are pure spirits with intelligence and free will (*Catechism of the Catholic Church, No. 330*).

The belief in angels is a Catholic doctrine based on Scriptural evidence. Throughout the Bible, God sends angels to announce his will, punish, strengthen, or console. Angels also protected and ministered to Jesus during his time on earth. We are also given guardian angels to watch over us (*Matthew 18:10*).

Finally, the Church joins in the adoration of the angels at Mass (*CCC #335*).

God loves each of us uniquely and fiercely no matter where we come from or how we look. Those of us who follow him know that it's not just important to love each other. It's God's law. Practice patience. It can be tough to listen to someone with a speech impediment or a heavy accent. Imagine, though, how grateful that person will be when you offer your attention. Perhaps it would help to imagine the face of Christ in the face before you. Counsel the ignorant. Someone from another country, background, or with different abilities than yours might behave in what looks like an inconsiderate way out of ignorance or limitations. He might appreciate being informed. Speak up. Don't stay quiet when you witness prejudice, and be positive about diversity if friends or relatives start criticizing others' faith, cultures or abilities.

Act with love. The God of love gave of himself so we could be reunited with him. We share that love when we assume the best of others and look for the good in all God's children
