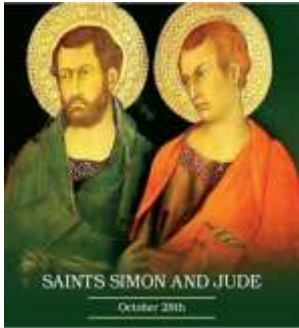

The Church honors Saints Simon and Jude, two of the Twelve Apostles, on October 28. Very little is known about these two, except what is briefly mentioned about them in the Gospels. They are both listed among those named by Jesus: Matthew 10:2-4; Mark 3:16-19; Luke 6:13-16; Acts 1:13.

This Simon is not Simon Peter, but rather “Simon the Cananean” and “the Zealot” (Luke and Acts). Jude, known as “Judas son of James”, (Luke and Acts) also has the name “Thaddeus” (Matthew and Mark). The only other reference about Jude with certitude comes from John’s Gospel during the Last Supper in which Jude is referred to as “Judas, not the Iscariot...” (John 14:22). During the Last Supper, Jesus instructed His Apostles that He would soon leave them, but they should have courage and wait for His Advocate, the Holy Spirit.

In the 3rd chapter of his letter to the Galatians, St. Paul wrote: “all of you who were baptized into Christ have clothed yourselves with Christ. ## RELATIONSHIP WITH GOD

Today's readings invite us into prayer, into relationship with God. Because relationships feel more natural when we know one another well, Sirach encourages us to know God better. In his wisdom, Sirach tells us what God is like: fair, open-minded, compassionate, and attentive. "The Lord will not delay," he says. Knowing that God's help comes right on time, whenever we need it, calms our hearts and helps us trust the Lord. In his second Letter to Timothy, Saint Paul demonstrates his own trust in God. Despite the grueling struggles Saint Paul has faced because of his Christian faith, he praises the Lord for rescuing him time and again. Today's Gospel draws us close to Jesus too, revealing his special love for the poor and humble. As Jesus tells his parable about the prayer habits of a Pharisee and a tax collector, our hearts long to become as gentle as Christ's.

## NEXT WEEKEND'S READINGS: ALL SOULS' DAY

Next weekend celebrates All Souls' Day and, thus, have different readings. The Gospel comes from the introduction to the Bread of Life Discourse in John 6 and is often heard at funerals:

"Everything that the Father gives Me will come to Me, and I will not reject anyone who comes to Me, because I came down from Heaven not to do My own will but the Will of the one who sent Me. And this is the Will of the One Who sent Me, that I should not lose anything of what He gave Me, but that I should raise it on the last day."

Today we pray for those who have died but have not been declared a saint. While the souls of the faithful were not reconciled before dying and, thus, are not ready for full union with God, they were claimed and accepted Jesus Christ. As a result, they are not lost, but need our prayers. They can pray for us, but they can do nothing to merit the graces needed for whatever sins to be forgiven.

The church office will be closed on Friday, October 31st, in observance of All Saints' Day. The office will reopen on Monday, November 3rd.

## STEWARDSHIP

Autumn stewardship refers to the care of natural resources and environments during the Fall season. The wise man knows that the more storing away in Autumn and tempering his self-indulgence, the more comfortable and ready he will be later. This was evident in the Old Testament when Joseph, the son of Jacob, was put in place to get the Mediterranean through the seven years of famine. As a result, autumn stewardship can also refer to religious stewardship, where congregations or groups reflect on and plan for the months ahead. As disciples of Christ, we are taught and prepared for the concept of sacrifice.
