St. Ignatius of Antioch

This St. Ignatius was not the one most people are familiar with who started the Society of Jesus aka the Jesuits. This one was a bishop, a martyr, and existed centuries before. This Ignatius was a disciple of the Apostle John. In the year 107, Emperor Trajan visited Antioch & forced Christians there to choose between apostasy & death. Ignatius refused to deny Jesus &

thus, was condemned to be put to death in Rome. St. Ignatius of Antioch is well-known for the seven letters he wrote on the long journey from Antioch to Rome. Five of these letters are to churches in Asia Minor, urging Christians there to remain faithful to God & to obey their superiors. He warned against heresies, providing them with the solid truths of the Christian faith.

The sixth letter was to Polycarp, bishop of Smyrna, who also was martyred. His final letter begged Christians in Rome not to try to stop his martyrdom: "The only thing I ask of you is to allow me to offer the libation of my blood to God. I am the wheat of the LORD; may I be ground by the teeth of the beasts to become the immaculate bread of Christ." Ignatius bravely met the lions in the Circus Maximus. His feast day is October 17.

PASTOR'S CORNER

Autumn Greetings,

As we have entered the month of October, we approach that time when people may argue about Halloween and how to treat that holiday. As a kid at heart, I enjoy celebrating the scariness and the getting dressed up to go trick-or-treating. As a priest who knows about spiritual warfare and how the majority of people are unaware of evil and how they insinuate themselves into our minds, hearts, and lives, I understand the other side of the debate well. All the more we are given the opportunity to discuss evil with our children.

When I was in seminary, we were taught that there will be movies that the Church will oppose & instruct the people of God to avoid. However, it was also suggested that we view the movies so that we are able to discuss with our parishioners exactly what happened and why so that we would know first-hand what was wrong with the movie so as to be able to correctly talk about it and not just blindly continue to echo the Church's stance.

We want to discourage our youth from glorifying evil, but not all fictitious, scary, or fun characters are evil. We need to learn the balance between fear of evil and the need to courageously stand against it. If we are taught to fear evil, how will we fight it? As St. Paul wrote to the Romans: "If God is for us, who can be against?". Of course, Scripture also teaches that we are not to test the LORD our God. Jesus talked about evil spirits often and numerous events recorded Him casting them out - for a reason. We need to talk about our children so that they can recognize how evil works and tries to influence so that they are stronger and more ready to ignore or overcome it.

Just as military commanders and even sports coaches spend time with their teams to identify and talk about their opponents strategies, we need to do the same when it comes to evil. And yes, this begins by not glorifying evil but exposing it.

**NEXT WEEKEND'S READINGS:
29TH SUNDAY OF ORDINARY TIME**

In next weekend's readings we hear Jesus teach about persevering in prayer. Cross-reference this Gospel with Matthew 6:7-8: "In praying, do not babble like the pagans, who think that they will be heard because of their many words. Do not be like them. Your Father knows what you need before you ask Him." When we pray repetitive prayers, the focus should not be on the words, but on the mysteries & "imitating what they contain" & learning some lesson. Often, God allows things to happen so as to bring us to pray because we had not spoken to Him in some time. This was evident in the numerous times the Israelites turned away from God & He allowed their enemies to oppress them. We need to persevere in prayer, as in communicate with Him often, even if in a different ways.

STEWARDSHIP

As we grow older, hopefully we become wiser, gifted increasingly with wisdom & knowledge from our experiences & learning how life works & how God seems to operate. How does our stewardship change in this process? Do we share more? Or do we think "I have done enough."? This attitude is what Evagrius of Pontus called acedia, "the noonday devil" in which we get to the time of the day, or life, in which we think this & feel we can lessen our stewardship & efforts. However, this thinking is pride, telling us to not continue as good stewards when rather we should remain good stewards, but merely in different ways, based upon what we are now able to do.
