PASTOR'S CORNER

Brothers and Sisters,

When I preach, I often encourage people to read the Bible regularly, even pray using it which is called Lectio Divino. Sometimes I am asked which Bible to use? The translation used at Mass comes from the New American Bible. While it is not the best translation, the "Catholic Study Edition" has good footnotes, maps, and a glossary, but it has flaws in several respects. It is good as reading it and learning the texts are easier to commit to memory.

The Bible has been translated from Hebrew and Greek into English many times in the past (4) centuries, with each translation having advantages and disadvantages. Some better translations include the Doahy-Rheims, Jerusalem and the New Jerusalem versions. Years ago Pope Francis stated that the Our Father was incorrectly translated in the "do not deliver us into temptation." There are other examples of poor translations and this is how people learn incorrectly Scripture theology.

They failed to read St. Paul's caveat in Galatians 1: 8 - "if we or an angel from Heaven should preach [to you] a gospel other than the one we preached to you, let that one be accursed!" Christians have translated Bibles so as to teach what they wish. They failed to read from 2 Peter 1: "no prophecy of Scripture is a matter of personal interpretation, for no prophecy ever came through human will; but rather human beings moved by the Holy Spirit spoke under the influence of God" (cf 20-21).

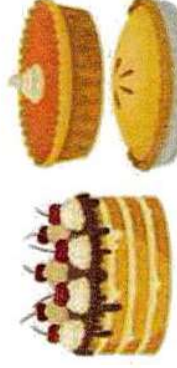
We need to avail ourselves of Sacred Scripture so as to become more familiar with God and His ways.

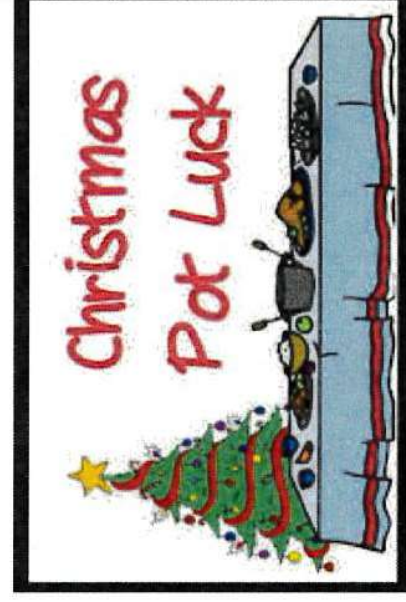
