STEWARDSHIP

The saints were good stewards/servants of God, and their stewardship was part of their daily living, flowing from their love for God & neighbor. It was a by-product as they evangelized. Their stewardship is an icon for us to imitate however we can.

PASTOR'S CORNER

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Last weekend's celebration of All Souls' Day opened up a number of conversations after Mass, so I thought I would continue the discussion. As I mentioned, "purgatory" is more of a process than a place whereas Heaven is the ultimate and obviously preferred destination. I might have recently talked about the "three different Churches": the Church militant (here on earth as we fight the battle); the Church Triumphant (Heaven where the communion of saints have reached); and the Church suffering (where souls are before they can enter Heaven). They are suffering as they are not quite yet there.

St. Paul talks about the members of the body of Christ as "living stones" building up the Church. We begin this process in this life. Just as we have beautiful icons, statues, and stained glass windows that depict the various glorious saints throughout Church history, the saint beautify the Church, the mystical body of Christ. We are also called to beautify the Church as well as the church building in which we worship. This beautification is in how we take care of our campus, primarily our worship space. It is also how we participate at the Mass and the life of the parish and Church.

Just as some attend Mass more than on the weekends and may be involved in parish activities, others do the "bare minimum" and spend only one day/hour a week. In parallel to the mystical body of Christ, the universal Church, the former group could be likened to all those things that are in the main worship space while those of the latter group might be found in the narthex. God is in the sanctuary where the Eucharist, the Altar of Sacrifice, the Altar of the Word, and the priest and other ministers are. God wants us to be as close to Him as possible, but our participation in the Liturgy of the Mass as well as the liturgy of life demonstrates to Him how close we want to be.

Where do we hope to find ourselves after God calls us from this life? How we participate in the life of the Church (and church) prepares our place in our Father's Mansion of many places (cf. John 14:

2). Let's prepare well!
