


CATHOLIC CHURCH OF THE RESURRECTION

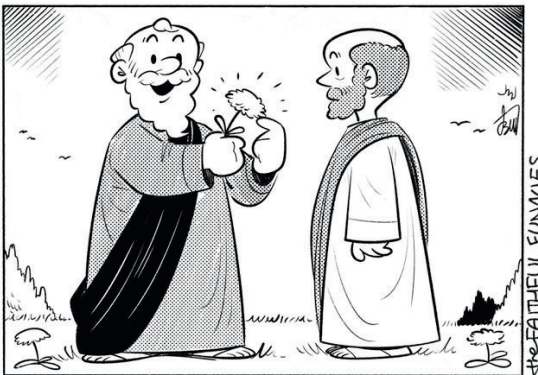
Catholic Trivia - Just for Fun

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PASTOR'S LETTER

Happy Easter!

As we celebrate Good Shepherd Sunday, I would like to share one of the areas of my pastoring that I question myself. Every priest/pastor "loses" sheep from their flock at times - whether due to job transfers, change in life, or something upset them at the parish, or they want to be fed different "food." Sometimes people come "here" when they could have gone someplace closer; other times, they may leave to go to another parish for various reasons.

A few years ago I learned of a parish family that had stopped attending Mass although they did not move far away. They could have used some pastoral ministry but had not been coming to Mass due to significant health issues. No one told me. Some knew, but did not share the information. Isolation was detrimental to the ailing parishioner. Fortunately, it was rectified.

Please know that at ordination God does not bestow on priests the ability to read minds. We depend on people sharing information (not gossiping) so as to ensure that people are cared for. Priests neither take attendance nor police people. We understand that people travel or even move without informing their parish. When people are sick, sometimes they do not want to be a burden, but this is what family are there for!

If nothing else, we pray & be ready when called to minister to someone when they let us know. It helps the shepherd to have an idea where and how to begin to look for lost sheep.

NEXT SUNDAY'S READINGS

Fifth Sunday of Easter

In next weekend's Gospel, Jesus said: "In My Father's house there are many dwelling places." St. Paul talks about the Church as built up by "living stones" referring to us. If we were to parallel these two theological statements to each other, we could see that we build up the Church and the "place" that is prepared for us is based upon our participation - or lack thereof - in His Church. Are we preparing our eternal rest to be closer to the sanctuary or the closet, for example? Would we be like a floor tile or a stained-glass window? While this is not theologically accurate, we also do not know what Jesus' statement meant exactly. We do know that there are (9) choirs of angelic beings with the Seraphim and Cherubim being the closest to Him so a degree of closeness exists. If we could reserve where we wanted to be in His Kingdom at the moment of death but would have to live intentionally to reserve that space, where do we want to be or how close to God's Throne and what are we willing to do to ensure that we get there?

STEWARDSHIP

We are only (3) months into this year's Catholic Appeal of South Carolina but still need to reach the goal set for us. Many need to fulfill their pledge, but some have not made an initial pledge.
