NEXT SUNDAY'S READINGS**Fifth Sunday of Lent**

In next weekend's readings we hear about Jesus raising Lazarus from the dead. This was not the only time Jesus raised someone from the dead, but it was the most notable and affective - back then and ever since. Jesus had also raised Jairus' daughter (Matt 9; Mark 5; Luke 8) and the son of the widow in Nain (Luke 7), but these are often overlooked in comparison. This was to prepare His various disciples of His ability to resurrect Himself from the dead. How often does God show us that He can get us through something difficult, only for us to forget what He has done when something else shakes our faith? How can we strengthen ourselves from those things that cause us to lose faith?

STEWARDSHIP

As we continue in our Lenten journey, we remember that almsgiving atones for our sins. Almsgiving is a form of stewardship as we use our financial assets to provide for another, fulfilling what Scriptures have dictated for us to do. In the Torah almsgiving, known as tzedakah (charity/justice), is a duty to help the poor, vulnerable, and marginalized, especially the stranger, widow, and orphan. In Tobit 12: 8-9 we hear that "Prayer with fasting is good. It is better to give alms than to store up gold, for almsgiving saves from death, and purges all sin."

My dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

As we officially begin the Year of Catechesis for Via Fidelis in 2026 this month, our focus turns to some of the resources that excellent Catholic organizations have developed in recent years, namely podcasts. There are many easy to digest resources on the Bible and the Catechism that can be helpful for cradle Catholics and converts alike to rediscover the written teachings of our faith. You can find them wherever you regularly listen to podcasts.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church, a major focus this year, and the Bible act as two hinges to the same door of understanding the Church's doctrine and dogma. Since the Word became flesh in the Incarnation and sacrificed his life for us on the wood of the Cross, Jesus made sure that we have all the tools to know and pursue Him.

As St. Peter said, "His divine power has bestowed on us everything that makes for life and devotion, through the knowledge of Him Who called us by His own glory and power" (2 Pt 1:3). So, as we listen to the Voice of God through Scripture and the words of the Church fathers, let us pray that the Holy Spirit guide us to know what we are called to do for others, especially those who need God's healing grace and mercy.

I pray for you and your families as you deepen your relationships through the power of the enduring Word of God. May it echo in your lives and in your encounters with those around you.
